

ART 10

COURSE OUTLINE

Art 10 is an introductory course that teaches a variety of new studio techniques, ideas and materials, art history and art criticism.

The program consists of:

- 1) A drawing unit based on still life.
- 2) A sculpture unit introducing metal techniques and jewellery design.
- 3) A printmaking unit utilizing a variety of different techniques (time permitting).
- 4) An acrylic painting unit based on techniques using gesso.
- 5) A sculpture unit using the mask as subject matter (time permitting).

Each unit consists of several projects to complete.

FINAL PROJECT:

There is a final project in Art 10 worth 30% of your final mark. This project will be your choice from one of the units taught during this semester. This assignment's evaluation is based on ongoing observations during the time assigned to highlight areas of growth and strength. The final mark will be determined through the use of a rubric based on specific criteria and performance indicators. Neglecting to complete this assignment may result in failing and not earning the five credits for this class. You will be expected to produce one project plus all preliminary drawings.

EVALUATION:

The course evaluation is as follows:

- PROJECTS	=	40%
- EFFORT	=	40%} TERM WORK
- SKETCHBOOK	=	20%

The assessment tools used for each assignment will be based on the specific criteria to be learned. The tools used will be rubrics, scoring guidelines, and anecdotal records. The final mark in Art 10 is based on 70% of your term work added to the 30% earned from the final project.

SKETCHBOOK:

One requirement in Art 10 is to develop ideas through your sketchbook. You will be given a sketchbook as part of your fees and use this to do your sketches in. There are assignments given for this book for both class projects and sketchbooks. The sketchbook ideas will be generated through a list given to you by the teacher.

ELECTRONIC DEVICE USAGE:

Electronic devices when used appropriately can be an integral part of a 21st Century society. However, any device that is used inappropriately can negatively affect the learning of students and/or staff and is a clear disruption of

a learning environment. Sometimes you will need to use your device in the art classroom for researching images and information. It is allowed for appropriate usage if permission is asked.

DUE DATES:

You will be expected to hand in assignments on a designated due date. Failure to do so will result in penalties of 10% per day. Each assignment is weighted heavily so missing one or two may result in failing the art class!

CLASS ROOM EXPECTATIONS:

1. All projects must be kept in the proper storage area, if not they will be thrown out! **ASSIGNMENTS ARE TO BE KEPT IN THE ART 10 CUPBOARD!**
2. You must come to class with all the necessary supplies, if not you will be given a written assignment to do!
3. All projects must be marked with your name; if this is missing a zero will be given.
4. The teacher's desk and filing cabinet is off limits for all students!
5. The Art 20 and 30 cupboards are off limits to you!
6. **You are responsible for your tables and the floor around the table, if you do not keep these areas clean YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO WORK ON THE PROJECT IN THE CLASSROOM!**
7. Each student will be responsible sometime during the semester for cleaning the sinks and counter areas.
8. You may bring a drink to this class as long as all containers have a screw top and are placed in the proper recycling receptacles. Eating is not allowed in the classroom since many materials are toxic if ingested.
9. You will be expected to be in class on time. The school late policy is strictly enforced in the art room.
10. Any art books borrowed from the art room must be signed out and returned by the next class.
11. Do not leave any art supplies, personal supplies and library books within the classroom. They are the responsibility of the student and not the art room!

COURSE FEE:

The course fee for Art 10 is **\$45.00** this year. This fee covers all supplies but those listed below.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Due to the high cost of art supplies you must purchase some items above the school art fee. Most of the following, excluding the drawing materials, can be found at home. The pencil assortment is the same as the one needed for art in grade nine and will suffice for Art 10.

DRAWING:

The student must purchase the following art supplies:
