

Art 20

Course Outline

The Art 10/20/30 program is a sequential course that builds each year toward a specific goal. The main goal in Art 10 was for the student to learn different ways of working with a variety of materials and specific techniques. The Art 20 program is concerned with the exploration of personal artistic style through experiment, expertise and development in the media of their choice.

The Art 20 program consists of the following:

- 1) A colour unit using pencil crayons as the medium.
- 2) A unit in black and white using unique techniques in composition.
- 3) A unit investigating jewelry design and creation.
- 4) A unit investigating pastel techniques.
- 5) A unit investigating paper clay sculpture (time permitting).

FINAL PROJECT:

There is a final project in Art 20 worth 30% of your final mark. This assignment's evaluation is based on ongoing observations during the time assigned to highlight areas of growth and strength. The final mark will be determined through the use of a rubric based on specific criteria and performance indicators. ***You will be expected to produce TWO PROJECTS in any media from Art 10 or 20. All preliminary drawings and the assignments must be handed in together!***

SKETCHBOOK:

One requirement in Art 20 is to have a sketchbook for this class. I will assign drawings to complete from a list of ideas. It is not necessary to purchase a new sketchbook; you will be given one through your fees. If this is lost you must replace it to receive the marks. You will be given a list of ideas to work from. If the drawing is not completed on the due date, the mark will be a zero. This is an area where your own originality may hopefully shine especially if there is effort to create an interesting piece. **If you do more drawings, I will accept them as extra credits!**

DUE DATES:

You will be expected to hand in assignments on a designated due date. Failure to do so will result in penalties of 10% per day. Each assignment is weighted heavily so missing one or two may result in failing the art class.

EVALUATION:

The course evaluation is as follows:

The assessment tools used for each assignment will be based on the specific criteria to be learned. The tools used will be rubrics, scoring guidelines, and anecdotal records. The final mark in Art 20 is based on 70% of your term work added to the 30% earned from the final project.

COURSE FEE:

The course fee for Art 20 is **\$50.00** this year. This fee covers all supplies but painting or drawing materials such as drawing pencils, erasers, etc. Any additional jewelry projects beyond the required unit will cost the student extra.

CLASS ROOM EXPECTATIONS:

1. All projects must be kept in the proper storage area, if not they will be thrown out!
ASSIGNMENTS ARE TO BE KEPT IN THE ART 20 CUPBOARD or in portfolios at the front of the classroom!
2. You must come to class with all the necessary supplies, if not you will be given a written assignment to do!
3. All projects must be marked with your name; if this is missing a zero will be given.
4. The teacher's desk and filing cabinet is off limits for all students!
5. The Art 10 and 30 cupboards are off limits to you!
6. **You are responsible for your tables and the floor around the table, if you do not keep these areas clean YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO WORK ON THE PROJECT IN THE CLASSROOM!**
7. Each student will be responsible sometime during the semester for cleaning the sinks and counter areas.
8. You may bring a water bottle to this class only. Eating can be dangerous due to the materials used in the class.
9. You will be expected to be in class on time. The school's late policy is strictly followed in the art room - three times being late and your parents/guardians will be notified. After the first three the administration will be contacted.
10. Cell phone usage that is not class room related is not allowed in the classroom. The first time caught, the phone will be taken away for the period. The next time, your phone will be sent to the office. Ask permission if you want to use the camera operation to record your artwork or if your phone is used for music.
