## **ART 90**

### **Course Outline**

The Art 90 program is a well-rounded course based on studio work, sketchbook assignments and art appreciation. This program consists of a variety of mediums and art projects, which will include the following:

- An introductory drawing unit
- Colour Theory
- Watercolour
- Printmaking
- Art Appreciation
- Sculpture Unit (time permitting)
- Final Project

### **Course Fee:**

The course fee for Art 90 is **\$25.00** this year. This fee covers the majority of the art materials needed, including:

- A Sketchbook
- Paints
- Charcoal
- Oil Pastels
- Conte Crayons
- India Ink
- Paper – both Watercolour and drawing paper

### **Students need to bring in the following art supplies:**

- An Assortment of drawing pencils (2H-6B)/charcoal pencil
- A white eraser
- Pencil Crayons (Prisma Colour are good but more expensive)
- Scissors and a Ruler

### **Sketchbook:**

A sketchbook is an important part of Art 90 to organize project ideas and to complete required sketchbook assignments. It is supplied through student fees but will not be replaced if lost. Drawings that are loose or those on-lined paper **will not** be accepted. The sketchbook will be handed in four times during the semester, twice in each term. You will be given a list of assignments to complete in the book. Extra sketches will be marked as extra credit toward the midterm or final term mark.

## **Evaluation:**

- Projects 70%
- Sketchbook 10%
- Final Project 20%

## **Class Room Expectations:**

1. **ALL** projects must be kept in the proper storage area! If they are not stored properly the projects will be thrown out.
2. You **must** come to class with the necessary materials.
3. All assignments must include your name, grade, class letter and the date.
4. You are responsible for your table and the floor around the table as well as making sure that the sinks and counters have been cleaned at the end of each class.
5. No food or drink allowed in the classroom except for water.
6. You are expected to be on time for each class and responsible for any missed work.
